Trash/ Recycle Issues

Just a reminder that if you have any issues with trash or recycle pick up our office will gladly assist you. Trash pickup is every Thursday morning and recycle is once a month. The dates for recycle pick up are posted on the sign at Conklin Park and on our website.

Fall Notes

Leaf and grass burning is prohibited in the Village of Ravenna. Curbside yard waste pickup is available for Village residents through November 30th. Bundles must be no longer than 4ft in length and a reasonable weight for lifting. Yard waste in cans should be marked as yard waste or in biodegradable bags (no plastic bags will be picked up). The Village also has a yard waste drop off site near the sewer lagoons off of Adams Road.

Roadways

With winter approaching, it's necessary to offer another reminder. Please remember to park your vehicles in your driveway at night. The Village has street parking restrictions from 2 AM to 6AM. It's difficult for the DPW to plow when a vehicle is parked on the road or the shoulder.

Parks and Recreation

Please help keep our parks clean for everyone to use. If you have children playing sports, please encourage them and their teammates to pick up the area after practices and games. We also need the help of sports fans and trail walkers. Please, if you see items such as water bottles or food wrappers left on the ground, pick them up and place them in a trash receptacle.

Bathrooms at Thatcher Park and on the east side of Conklin Park will be closing for the winter the end of October. The west side Conklin Park bathrooms will remain open.

Animal Control/Pets

Ordinance 91 defines several requirements "for all persons who keep animals" in section 2. Common violations of this ordinance include:

-Having more than 2 dogs and 2 cats.-Having an animal not on a leash in a public park or public property.

-Not cleaning up the excrement from the animal on other people's or public property. If you see a dog or cat loose or you or your pet are attacked please call the Muskegon County Sherriff's Department for an animal control officer to investigate.
